

## **God's Acre Remembrance Day**

Archerfield Airport Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2017 from 10:00am

Welcome to our Remembrance Day for 2017 and thank you for coming along and showing your support for the protection of this historic cemetery.

God's Acre is believed to be Brisbane's oldest surviving cemetery. It commenced on 26<sup>th</sup> October 1859 when Thomas and Mary Grenier buried their 16 year old son Volney on the family property in what was then New South Wales. Just over 6 weeks later Governor Bowen arrived in Brisbane and read the Proclamation declaring Queensland a separate State.

The Grenier family farmed the land that is now Archefield Airport and grew oats, maize and potatoes on the rich, black alluvial soil. They also bred horses and the Grenier children were fine horse riders.

Thomas Grenier, the father, was buried in God's Acre on 7<sup>th</sup> October 1877. In his will Thomas left the land that is now God's Acre Cemetery as a district cemetery and it became known as the Coopers Plains Cemetery. It is believed that there are approx. 240 persons buried in God's Acre representing 83 different pioneering families. The cemetery was closed in 1931.
