5.0	<p><b>Archerfield Airport Corporation - update</b></p> <p><b>Introduction of the new General Manager Mr Rod Parry</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rod comes to AAC after a long career in aviation working with both airlines and airports, in Australia and overseas. His last role was CEO of Hobart Airport before attempting to take early retirement.</li> <li>• <b>Main item:</b> Minister has now approved the Major Development Plan (MDP) for Project AIM, which will extend and strengthen the main runway and associated aeronautical infrastructure. Detailed planning has now commenced, with an expected project commencement date of February 2020.</li> </ul>
6.0	<p><b>Brisbane Airport</b></p> <p><b>Presentation Neil Hall (BAC)</b></p> <p><b>Brisbane Airport new Runway update</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Brisbane new runway has finalised airspace design, this design has been completed using the latest aircraft navigation technology and standards to provide best possible safety, efficiency and aircraft noise outcome's within the requirements of the EIS</li> <li>• The design will accommodate future fleet acquisition to support ongoing improvements in efficiency and reductions in emission's and noise.</li> <li>• All jet aircraft operations will be following flight paths coded into aircraft and air traffic control systems allowing the auto pilot to manage the fuel burn and improving predictability, this combined with careful positioning of departure and arrival cross over points allows continuous climb and descent for most operations, improving efficiency and reducing noise</li> <li>• Noise abatement ensure maximum use is made of flights over the bay at night and there will be no flights to or from the new runway over residents south of the airport between 10pm and 6am</li> <li>• Airspace change proposal was approved by airspace regulator CASA late 2018</li> <li>• A new parallel runway system airspace will be implemented 21<sup>st</sup> May 2020 and the cross runway (14/32) will close on this date</li> <li>• New runway will then open once on ground infrastructure, testing and training is completed</li> <li>• Brisbane's new runway information on website will include BNE'S mobile information centre- includes schedule :             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Flight path tool- interactive, enter address – how high, how many now and after runways opens</li> <li>○ Flight path and Aircraft noise information booklet</li> <li>○ Impact of Aircraft Noise on Brisbane Residential property</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Community update program commenced late 2018 and will continue beyond runway opening , using Benny the mobile information centre and the interactive flight path tool ( bne.com.au/flightpaths)</li> <li>• Brisbane airport has retained the terminal lease back from Qantas</li> <li>• There will be a further \$40,000,000. 00 to be spent on upgrading the Domestic terminal</li> </ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BNE have a mobile van (Benny) that goes to venues for any updates to the community, locked in schedule till end of October 2019 and continuing to after runway opening</li> <li>• Brisbane runway to open July 2020 – will be expecting a big opening and looking back into the history of the airport</li> <li>• Further refurbishments to Brisbane Airport will be getting further upgrades over the next 15 – 20 years</li> <li>• Brisbane’s Master plan is out for comment at the moment , 21<sup>st</sup> August it finishes for comments</li> </ul>

What are the 3 types of air traffic control available</li> <li>• Episode 2. How often does Air traffic Control talk to the pilots</li> <li>• QTR 1 &amp; 2 2019, which is accessible on Airservices website, there has been only 8 complaints in Q2 and nine in Q1- complaint numbers have been decreasing</li> <li>• During peak times of air travel in Australia there are 500 airborne aircraft under the control of Airservices traffic controllers</li> </ul>
